



Mr. Gerald A. Burklund

July 3, 1939 - January 17, 2021

Mr. Gerald A. Burklund, 81, of Dalton, passed away on Sunday, January 17, 2021. Born in Battle Creek, MI, in 1939, the son of the late Arthur and Marguerite Prince Burklund, he graduated from the University of Michigan with his bachelor's degree in Electrical Engineering.

Gerry worked in field engineering for General Electric in Pittsfield for 39.5 years until his retirement in 2003.

He enjoyed competitive sailing while living in Hawaii in 1971-73, volleyball and participating in the Mass Senior Olympics, as well as stunt kite flying. He traveled extensively with his wife to all 50 states, Europe, and the Caribbean. Gerry enjoyed learning new skills like wood working and macrame. He was executive director of the Dalton Camp Fire Girls in the late 70's, instructing in camping and canoeing skills. Gerry was an avid LEGO builder and collector. His collection exceeded 500,000 pieces.

Gerry was predeceased by his beloved wife of 54 years, the former Carol Miller, whom he married in 1964. Carol passed away in 2018. He leaves his daughter Donna Hess and her husband Gary in CT, his son Dale Burklund and his wife Rochelle in AZ, grandchildren Sydney and Austin Hess. He was predeceased by his brother Donald from MI.
