Mr. Patrick J Shepardson 56 of Pittsfield, MA, passed away unexpectedly early Monday morning, January 18, 2021.

Born in Pittsfield on August 25, 1964, he was the son of Bruce Shepardson and the Late Patricia McCullom Shepardson. He Graduated with the class of 1982 from Taconic High School in Pittsfield, MA.

Patrick began his love of Iron Welding while in School and working on the Co-op at Berkshire Bridge and Iron through his High School. Patrick was then hired right out of high school to work full time with Berkshire Bridge and Iron and his career expanded well over 25 plus years there. After that, he opened his own company and was Owner/Operator of Black Iron Welding until his passing.
