



Ms. Barbara A. Beeker

December 23, 1935 - September 24, 2022

Ms. Barbara A. Beeker, of Pittsfield, passed away on Saturday, September 24, 2022, just three months shy of celebrating her 87th birthday. Born in Pittsfield, MA, on December 23, 1935, the daughter the late Marion Hopper Beeker, she graduated in 1953 from St. Joseph High School in Pittsfield and later from St. Vincent's Hospital School of Nursing in New York with the class of 1956. Barbara continued her education, earning a bachelor's degree, also in Nursing, from Hunter College, a Master of Education from Columbia University, and later, a Doctorate in Education from there as well.

In 1962, Barbara began her career as a coordinator of the Practical Nurse Program for Pittsfield Vocational School. In the summer of 1965, she traveled to Guyana, where she worked as a consultant for the Pan American Health Organization. Returning from South America, Barbara took a new position as an assistant, and (soon-to-follow), associate professor at Russell Sage in New York. In 1977, she left New York and began work in Vermont, where she worked as not only a professor, but also chairperson for the Department of Professional Nursing at the University of Vermont. In 1987, further adding to her accomplished career, Barbara started as Dean and Professor of Seton Hall University in NJ, from where she respectfully retired in 1999.

After retirement, Barbara returned home to Pittsfield, MA, where she was able to reconnect with many old friends and made many new, as well. Barbara

enjoyed gardening and was also thoroughly fond of traveling. She visited every continent (some numerous times), with the exception of Antarctica.

Barbara is survived by her brother, George Beeker (Roberta), as well as several cousins.
