Mr. Bernard J Bromback, 94, of Pittsfield, passed away on Tuesday, December 13, 2022. Born in Pittsfield, MA, on September 14, 1928, the son of the late John and Katherine Haggerty Bromback, he graduated from St. Joseph High School.

Bernard was first employed by Berkshire Woolen Mill on Pecks Road. He later worked at Crescent Creamery, from where he was best known (and loved) as “Bernie the Milkman”. Later, Bernard worked at Geary Corporation, from where he retired.
