



Mr. Brian A. Carroll

April 10, 1963 - July 19, 2025

Brian Carroll, a gifted wildlife artist and beloved brother, passed away in his sleep early Saturday, July 19, 2025, just months after celebrating his 62nd birthday. Born in Pittsfield, MA, on April 10, 1963, son of the late William and Rita DeNicola Carroll, he graduated from Taconic High School in 1981 and earned his Bachelor of Arts from UMass Dartmouth.

Known for his love of nature and extraordinary artistic talent, Brian brought beauty into the world through his art, cooking, and kind spirit. From intricately crafted fish replicas to beautiful paintings, Brian's work reflected his connection to the natural world. He had an unmatched eye for detail and a soul drawn to the wilderness—whether wandering the woods, casting a line, or bird watching.

An avid outdoorsman, Brian found joy in archery, hunting and fishing with his family and good friends. He was equally at home in the kitchen, where he enjoyed cooking, grilling and tending his herb and tomato plants.

Brian cherished his family deeply. He leaves behind his siblings, David Carroll and wife Debbie, Marita Carroll and husband John Sharp, Susan Carroll and husband Rick Lombardi, his twin sister Beth Carroll, Sandra Carroll and partner Joe Fowler and his sister-in-law Linda Carroll. Besides his parents, he was predeceased by his eldest brother Larry Carroll. He also was beloved

'Uncle Bri' to thirteen nieces and nephews.

For the majority of his career, Brian worked as a graphic designer. He was self-employed and also worked for Callahan Sign Company and most recently Doc's Signs and Truck Outfitters
