



Mrs. Christina T. Faye

November 14, 1936 - December 15, 2023

Mrs. Christina T. Faye, 87, of Dalton, passed away on Friday, December 15, 2023. Born in Springfield, MA, Nov. 14, 1936, she was the daughter of the late Christina MacLeod Warnock Ahrens and the late William Lyman Ahrens. She attended the local schools and graduated from Springfield Technical High School. She received her baccalaureate degree in History and Education from U. Mass. Amherst in 1958. Mrs. Faye was employed by the Central Berkshire Regional School District as a reading specialist for 23 years, retiring from Becket School on Jan. 1, 1991.

As a former member of Grace Episcopal Church, she served as a vestry person, and as a Lay Eucharistic Minister and Visitor; presently a member of St. Helena's chapel, Lenox. A former member of the Board of Directors for the Berkshire Talking Chronicle, she served on the advisory board of the Mass. Association for the Blind. She was a member of the Current Topic Club of Dalton, the Friends of the Dalton Free Public Library, Inc., the Clan MacLeod Society of the USA.; Retired Educators of Mass.

She and her husband, Robert G. Faye, were married Nov. 9, 1957. In addition to her husband, she is survived by a son, William C. Faye of Moodus, CT and his wife Katharine Lynn Kuhl Faye; a daughter, Patricia L. Scallion of Herring Cove, Nova Scotia, Canada and her husband Wallace E. Scallion She also leaves a niece, Mrs. Deborah Gillespie of Canton, CT, five grandchildren:
