Christopher David "Colonel" Kearns, 46, of Pittsfield passed away on May 22, 2018 at Berkshire Medical Center surrounded by his loving family. Born on May 31, 1971 in Pittsfield to Carol Izzo Kearns and David Kearns, Chris was a 1991 graduate of Pittsfield High School where he was an outstanding basketball player. Chris also played little league and Babe Ruth baseball throughout his youth.

Chris also had a passion for music and was a talented drummer. Chris was a longtime employee of the Massachusetts Turnpike Authority. He was a diehard Boston Red Sox fan and a Boston Celtic fan, especially of his idol #33 Larry Bird whom he tried to emulate.

In June of 2007 Chris married the love of his life, Angela Regnier, their love was strong and special. Chris adored Angela.

Chris leaves behind three children, Conner, Kaylee, and Keith. He absolutely adored his children as they did him. Chris also leaves behind his brother Michael (Angela Hunt), and sister Colleen Harte (David) whom he loved and would do anything for them; nephews Jake Harte and Joey Kearns; nieces Kacie and Kylie Harte who all adored uncle Chris. Chris also leaves his grandmother, Marion E.
