



Mr. Donald G. Crocker

September 1, 1924 - June 24, 2025

Our Dad, Papa and Great Papa, Mr. Donald G. Crocker, of Pittsfield, passed away on Tuesday, June 24, 2025, just a few months before celebrating his 101st birthday. Born in Pittsfield, MA, on September 1, 1924, son of the late George and Alice Boyer Crocker, he graduated from Pittsfield High School with the class of 1942.

Donald enlisted in the United States Army in May, 1943, where he proudly served his country as a surgical technician at the 112th hospital in Devon, England. After the end of the war in Europe, he was about to be sent to the Pacific Theater when that war also ended. He received his honorable discharge in September 1945.

It was during his time in England, that he met the love of his life, Jean Patricia Donabie of Torquay, England. Jean came to the United States in 1946. They married on October 26, 1946, and lived in Pittsfield until 1956 when they relocated to New Jersey. They returned to Pittsfield in 1983.

For the majority of his career, Donald was employed by Berkshire Street Railway as a bus driver in the early 1950's, Sayre & Fisher Brick Company in Sayreville, NJ and Ford Motor Company in Edison, New Jersey where he worked in their accounting department. It was from there that he retired after 18 years of dedicated service. Upon his return to Pittsfield, Don was a teller at

Berkshire County Savings Bank on North Street for 10 years.

In his leisure time, he enjoyed listening to music, especially the Big Bands of the 1940's. He also loved watching baseball, and was a loyal fan of the New York Mets. Additionally, Don enjoyed reading, especially about World War II history.

Donald was predeceased by his beloved wife of nearly 71 years, Jean, who passed away in 2017. He was also predeceased by his brothers, Richard, Norman, and Raymond Crocker.

Donald is survived by his children, Jeffrey (and Gina) Crocker of Pittsfield; Bryan (and Denise) Crocker of East Brunswick, NJ; and Andrea (and David) Kase of Spotswood, NJ. He leaves behind his grandchildren, Danielle Cox, Erik Kase, Erin Schiavino, Lauren Kolmer, Christopher Crocker and Evan Crocker, as well as his 8 great grandchildren: Matthew, Meghan, Amy, Owen, Carson, Lily, Brynn and Scott. Don is also survived by many nieces and nephews.
