Mrs. Ella F. Campbell, 79, of both Pittsfield, MA and Davenport, FL, passed away peacefully on Friday, July 23, 2021, at Kimball Farms Nursing Care Center in Lenox, MA. Ella was born in Mt. Vernon, IN, on June 10, 1942, to the late Melvin Buchanan and Margaret Fischer Buchanan.

Ella was a devoted wife and mother for most of her life.
