Mr. Ettore (Art) Guiseppe Monti, 87, of 580 South Main St., Lanesborough died Thursday evening, November 1, 2012 at Berkshire Medical Center. Born in Pittsfield on June 16, 1925 the son of Pietro and Rovestina Ricci Monti, he attended Pittsfield High School before joining the US Navy. Art served in action on the USS Langley in the South Pacific during WWII. He was very proud of the service he gave his country during the war.

Mr. Monti worked as core assembler for the Transformer division of General Electric in Pittsfield for 41 years, retiring in 1987.

He was a member of the GEAA where he was a former Senior Club Champion. He belonged to the GE Quarter Century Club and Pensioners.
