Mr. Gerald "Jerry" T. Hunt Sr., 70, of 52 Lakeview St., died Wednesday morning, November 14, 2012 at home in the arms of his loving wife. Born in Pittsfield on August 17, 1942 the son of William F. and Florence L. Colburn Hunt he was a 1960 graduate of Pittsfield High School.

Mr. Hunt worked as a Letter Carrier for the US Postal Service for 30 years, retiring in 2000.

He was a US Army Reserve veteran. He enjoyed restoring military vehicles and belonged to the Military Collectors Club.

Mr. Hunt was an accomplished woodworker and had formerly owned Jerry's Sash window company.
