Mr. Graham G. Gichiengo, 75, of Richmond, passed away on Tuesday, March 24, 2026. Born in Kijabe, Kenya, on November 5, 1950, son of Lizzie Mathu Gichiengo and the late Gordon Gichiengo, he graduated from Woodstock Academy and later attended classes at Eastern Connecticut State University.
