Mrs. Jean R. Johnson, 88, of Dalton Ave., passed away on December 27, 2016 at home. Born in North Adams on April 28, 1928, the daughter of Charles and Sarah Miller Robinson, she attended schools in North Adams. She moved to Pittsfield to attend Henry Bishop Memorial Training School for Nurses. A Registered Nurse, she served in public health in Pittsfield and Lanesboro and was a skilled homemaker.

Mrs. Johnson had been a member of the First Baptist Church in Pittsfield where she was active in Christian education, outreach, music, and leadership for most of her adult life. She also had been active at the Berkshire Community Church in Richmond. She was a member of the Eastern Star, Church Women United, and the Yankee Pride Quilt Guild. Many summers she worked as a nurse and cook at regional youth camps, especially the Royal Ambassador Boys Camp in Ocean Park, ME, and Camp Ashmere in Lanesboro, MA.

Jean enjoyed quilting and cooking and was known for her generosity, creativity, and great baking.

Mrs. Johnson was predeceased by her beloved husband, Donald A. Johnson, whom she married on October 6, 1951 in North Adams; he passed away in 2007. She is survived by her children, Melissa Jean Widitor and her husband Peter, Melanie Jean Johnson-DeBaufre and her husband Eric, and Sandra King and her husband Alan; a sister, Ella Robinson; and four grandchildren, Marcus Widitor, Grace Jean Johnson-DeBaufre, Nathaniel Widitor, and
