June 26, 1940 - June 4, 2021

Mr. Joseph T. Livecchi passed away on Friday, June 4, 2021, just weeks shy of his 81st birthday. Born in Pittsfield, Massachusetts, on June 26, 1940, the son of the late Charles and Josephine Calleri Livecchi, he graduated from Pittsfield High School in 1959.

For 63 dedicated years, up until his recent retirement in 2019, Joe worked as a self-employed barber for Royal Barber Service.

Among many things, he loved to travel, especially to his favorite places: Bermuda, Alaska, Canada, and Washington D.C. He enjoyed woodworking and riding his Gold Wing motorcycle. Most of all, the greatest pleasure of Joe's life was fostering the treasured relationships with his customers. This legacy that he took on from his father and passed down to his oldest son to carry forward meant the most to him; even to his last day, he sought peace in knowing that his customers are always happy and accommodated in every way possible.

He is survived by his two children, Thomas Livecchi of Pittsfield, Massachusetts and David Livecchi of Youngsville, Louisiana. He leaves behind his life partner, Mary Bushika Woolley, who was the love of his life, as well as his granddaughter, Emily Livecchi.
