On the cool summer evening of June 15, 2024, Martin Malnati Jr. joined his family in the hereafter. The eldest of six children of Martin and Irene (Adele Iemolini), "Junior" grew and ran the family dairy farm in Richmond where he was a lifelong resident. He was the last surviving pupil of Richmond's one room "little red schoolhouse" and graduated from Pittsfield High School.

Martin was a man of strong character and mind, fiercely independent, with a sweet side revealed only to a select few. He loved his animal companions, often including them on his Christmas card signature. They co-piloted him on long drives in his truck, frequenting the airport to watch the planes come and go, or the Dublin Road bridge counting the rail cars on the train. Martin had an impressive knowledge of the stock market and the Red Sox. He knew and had an opinion about all the local and town issues as well. He was a generous supporter of animal welfare and veteran's groups.

He was predeceased by his sisters Marjorie (Donald) Crawford, and Joan (John) Carroll, his brothers Joseph (Barbara), William (Dona) and Francis Malnati. He is survived by his sister in law, Patricia (Bator) Malnati. He also leaves nieces and nephews, grand-niece and grand-nephews and his beloved Good Girl, Daisy.
