Mr. Patrick P. (Carnie) Kearney, 82, of 200 West Housatonic St., passed away at Berkshire Medical Center ICU unit with his wife holding his hand and Jesus, Mary and Joseph watching over him.

Born in Pittsfield on March 17, 1931 the son of Luke M. and Gertrude Mullen Kearney, he was a 1949 graduate of Pittsfield High School.

He was a US Army veteran serving during the Korean War.
