Mr. Paul G. Duquette, 74, of Stamford, VT, passed away on Saturday, May 27, 2017 at Springside Rehabilitation and Skilled Care Center. Born in Pittsfield on October 3, 1942 the son of Donald and Marguerite Henneberry Duquette, he was a 1960 graduate of Pittsfield High School.

He went on to earn a degree from Wentworth Institute of Technology and a Master's degree from the University of Massachusetts Amherst.

Paul's greatest passion in life was in his chosen profession as an educator and mentor, encouraging students to reach their potential. He worked at Lenox Memorial High School from 1967 to 1982 and then became a professor of Math and Computer Science at MCLA from 1982 until 2015.

He was musically inclined and played many instruments from the trumpet with the PHS band to the fiddle and flute with a wonderful group of fellow musicians on Saturday mornings at MASS MoCA. His love of music lead him to contra dancing and the company of many who shared his favor.

Paul was also an outdoorsman, he loved hiking, biking, fly fishing and canoeing and trips that took him to diverse locations, especially his beautiful Berkshires.

He is survived by his four children, Fianna Toolan of Pittsfield, Paula Murphy of Housatonic, Christie Duquette Willaredt of Wesley Chapel, FL and Nicole Duquette; a brother, Donald B. Duquette and his wife Carol Ann; grandchildren, Madison and Tate Markel, Jacqueline Rose Thoresen Toolan, Eliza Murphy, Bailynn Henry and Zandyr Stimpson; 2 nephews, Jason and

Peter; his former wives, Jacqueline Toolan Benham and Michele “Lady” Duquette. Paul is also survived by many wonderful cousins, musician buddies and contra dancing partners and former students.

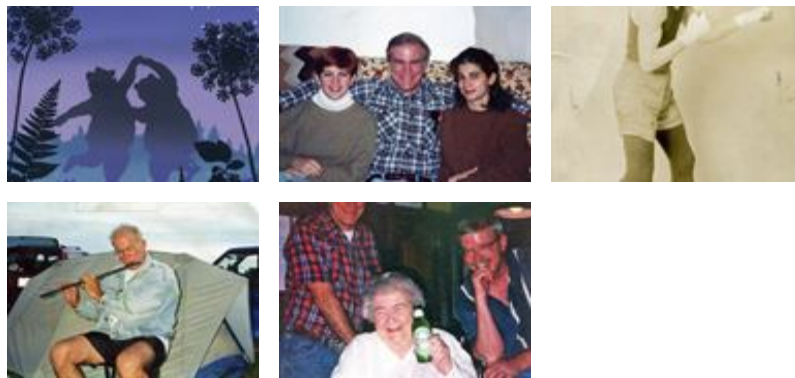

“ I'm sorry to hear of Paul's passing. Paul was one of my favorite professors at MCLA. I even went so far as to be one his teaching assist for one of his intro to programming class. He had a way to making the material accessible to people who never used a computer. This is something I strive for when I work to train people on various types of technology.

My favorite story he told was how he was taking his herbal supplements one morning and couldn't remember which one he hadn't taken yet. He explained it turned out to be his ginkgo biloba (commonly used to help with one's memory). He used to tell us stories of the start of the computer science department at MCLA and the effort it took to get it going.
