Mr. Paul A. Quinto, 78, of 58 Garland Ave., died Sunday evening, November 25, 2012 at home surrounded by his loving family. Born in Pittsfield on March 25, 1934 the son of Bonaventura and Elizabeth Panno Quinto, he was a 1951 graduate of Pittsfield High School.
