



Mr. Raymond O. MacWhinnie

June 23, 1930 - August 7, 2013

Mr. Raymond O. MacWhinnie, 83, of 272 Dalton Division Rd., passed away peacefully on Wednesday, at Berkshire Medical Center surrounded by his loving family.

Born in Pittsfield, on June 23, 1930, the son of the late David and Lillian Boedeker MacWhinnie, he attended local schools and was a 1951 graduate of Pittsfield High School. Continuing his education, he attended the former Berkshire Business College for two years.

Ray was a self-employed accountant for many years. He retired in 2010. Previously, he was the owner of the former Lanesborough Machine Shop, and he had also worked at O.W. Landergren and for Associated Transport.
