Mrs. Sarah L. Green, 82, of Dalton, passed away at Berkshire Medical Center on Monday, June 29, 2020. Born in Manchester, VT, on November 7, 1937, to the late Gordon and Ethel Hill Bentley, Sarah attended Burr and Burton Academy, an acclaimed independent secondary school located in Manchester, VT. Sarah excelled in her studies, was active in her class, and loved playing the coronet for the school and All-State bands.

Sarah met her sweetheart, Clarence W. Green, while she was still in High School, and they married just after she graduated in 1956. They recently celebrated their 64th wedding anniversary on June 23rd. Sarah was a homemaker, but was also very talented in retail, and held several positions until retiring in 2005, due to illness.

She enjoyed helping others, and also appreciated serving Sunday lunches at the Dalton Congregational Church for the Council on Aging. 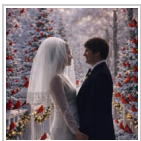
