Mr. Stanley J. Panus, 95, formerly of Taylor St., passed away on Wednesday, February 24, 2016 at Mt. Greylock Extended Care Facility. Born in Greenfield, MA on January 9, 1921 the son of Peter and Dominika Rudniska Panus, he was educated in Pittsfield schools and was a 1938 graduate of Pittsfield High School. Mr. Panus received his Bachelor's Degree in Electrical Engineering from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. He later received his Master's Degree as well as completing many certificate courses.

He was a Veteran of WWII. Mr. Panus was a Lieutenant JG in the US Navy serving as an aviator on the USS Guam.

Stanley worked for General Electric in Pittsfield as an Electrical Engineer in the Ordnance division. He retired in 1982 after 33 years of service.

He was a communicant of St. Joseph Church and a former communicant of Holy Family Church.
